People who have an intellectual disability have specific vulnerabilities when they have contact with the criminal justice system, from the time of apprehension to incarceration. They are more susceptible to suggestibility and false incrimination and if imprisoned, more likely to be physically, emotionally and financially abused.

Intellectual and Developmental Disability must be Included in Criminal Justice Reform. In January 2019, a woman filed a lawsuit on behalf of her daughter, who has Rett syndrome and does not speak or walk, after she was raped, impregnated, and injured at a healthcare facility. In 1989, Joe Sullivan, a 13-year-old with intellectual disabilities, was sentenced to life without parole for burglary.
