Palliative care must be included and clearly articulated in the Aged Care Quality Standards, which all Commonwealth funded aged care services are required to meet. All undergraduate nursing, allied health, medical courses and Certificate courses for care workers must include mandatory units on palliative care.

Palliative care is, according to the WHO (World Health Organisation), 'an approach that improves the quality of life of patients and their families facing the problems associated with life-threatening illness, through the prevention and relief of suffering by means of early identification and impeccable assessment and treatment of pain and other problems, physical, psychosocial and spiritual'.

Aged care and palliative care: what's the difference?

A palliative care consultation team is a multidisciplinary team that works with the patient, family, and the patient's other doctors to provide medical, social, emotional, and practical support. The team is made of palliative care specialist doctors and nurses, and includes others such as social workers, nutritionists, and chaplains.

In addition, there is a high burden of chronic disease and comorbidity in the residential aged care population (Hillen, Vitry & Caughey 2017).
