Read Books about the Brain, Thinking, Problem-solving, Mistakes, and Perseverance Books are an amazing way to open the window to metacognition. Any book that shows what the character is thinking or goes through the process of solving a problem, ideally in a unique way, will make an impression on your child and promote critical and innovative thinking.

Children's Books that Promote Critical Thinking

Listen carefully to children's ideas. Allow children to find their own solutions. Offer help when they become frustrated, but don't solve their problems for them. Use literature as a springboard. Share books that show how characters solve problems, such as King of the Playground by Phyllis Naylor and Caps for Sale by Esphyr Slobodkina.

Stimulate creative problem solving by asking children to predict what they will see or what would happen in a variety of situations. Children who have CD are known for their delinquent behavior and not obeying rules. About 5% American children, who are below ten years of age, have CD. The typical behaviors are: Refusing to follow the rules laid by parents or school authorities. Repetitive truancy. Trying abusive substances like alcohol, cigarettes, and drugs at a very early age.

Conversely, children who began grade 1 with strong basic reading skills did very well in reading with a teacher who provided relatively little direct phonics teaching but emphasized discussion of text from trade books and meaning-oriented writing activities from the start; presumably, these children had less need for systematic phonics teaching because they already possessed these skills.
